These have been used on a sliding scale and it is therefore it is important to note that 'needs improvement' refers to a significant concern.

There is also information on your child's attendance. Please note attendance is recorded as 2 openings per day – morning attendance and afternoon attendance.

Finally, each of your child's teachers has also provided information on your son/daughter's progress within that subject and this includes their targets/next steps. This report provides information on the curriculum level your child has achieved (achievement level) and their progress in the level at which they are currently working. This is recorded as either gold, silver or bronze. The table below gives more information on this, the example shown is for those pupils who have achieved third level.
