The purpose of this report is to provide you with tracking grades indicating how well your child is performing in their National Qualification subjects.

The report states the grades and levels at which your child is currently working – this is shown as the **Working Grade** on the report. To maintain or improve on these grades, pupils will need to apply themselves fully both in class and at home. The **Target Grade** demonstrates the grade which the class teacher thinks your child is capable of if they work to their full potential.

This report also contains ratings for **behaviour**, **effort** and **homework**. These ratings are accompanied by the terms **Excellent**, **Good**, **Inconsistent** and **Needs Improvement**.

There is also information on your child's attendance. Please note attendance is recorded as 2 openings per day – morning attendance and afternoon attendance.
